



WINSTON CHURCHILL 1874–1965

On 20 October 2025, La Poste will issue the world's first "talking" stamp. Equipped with artificial intelligence, this stamp will allow users to ask questions about Winston Churchill, regarded as one of the greatest statesmen of the twentieth century, to mark the sixtieth anniversary of his death.

Background

Winston Churchill is considered one of the greatest statesmen of the twentieth century. Born in 1874 to an American mother and a father descended from the Duke of Marlborough, he began a military career that took him to four campaigns across the British Empire. Elected as a Member of Parliament in 1900 at the age of

25, as Minister at 31, and twice as Prime Minister, his political career spanned nearly 60 years.

With his biting sense of humour and disregard for convention, he made many enemies. He stood out for his unique combination of courage, inventiveness, determination (sometimes bordering on obstinacy), authoritarianism, and historical vision.

When Hitler came to power in Germany in 1933, Churchill was one of the few parliamentarians to warn of the danger, predict war, and call for the rearmament of the country. Although politically isolated, the events that followed proved him right. In May 1940, when France was invaded, he was appointed Prime Minister. His speech on 13 May made history: "I have nothing to offer but blood, toil, tears and sweat." Against all those who sought a compromise peace, he refused to lay down arms. "We shall never surrender", he declared on 4 June 1940. Thanks to him, Britain held out, alone in the face of Nazism, until the invasion of the Soviet Union, followed by the attack on Pearl Harbor.

With his famous cigar and his V-for-Victory salute, he became the embodiment of a nation at war and of resistance to totalitarianism. After 1945, he became famous for his Fulton speech on the Iron Curtain and his Zurich speech on European unity. The author of more than 40 works, he received the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1953. A great friend of France, he was made a Companion of the Liberation in 1958. When he died in 1965, his funeral was worthy of a king.

Accessible to everyone with a simple scan of the QR code, this stamp combines tradition and technological innovation to bring history to life.


